



# Whitefield boys win area cross country championship

The Whitefield Academy boys scored 21 points and placed six runners in the top 10 to win the Area 6A cross country championship Thursday at the Darlington School.

The WolfPack's Devin Wade won the individual title in 16 minutes, 59.26. Caleb Corliss (third, 17:50.30), Zachary Justice (fourth, 17:53.01), Nicholas Harris (fifth, 17:57.58), Sean Morris (eighth, 18:30.37) and Colson Gullede (ninth, 18:33.61) also contributed for Whitefield.

The top four teams advanced to the Class A private-school state championships Nov. 3 in Carrollton. Mount Paran Christian was second with 87 points, followed by Darlington (92) and North Cobb Christian (113).

Mount Paran's Jonathan House was second in 17:42.82 to lead the Eagles. Connor Constantine placed sixth in 18:06.11 to lead North Cobb Christian.

In the girls meet, Whitefield's Emily Little claimed the individual title in 19:56.20 — more than 30 seconds ahead of her next competitor — to qualify as

an individual at the state meet. The Lady Wolfpack were fifth as a team and did not advance.

Whitefield's Annie Edwards also qualified as an individual after finishing sixth in 21:26.65.

Mount Paran scored 82 points and placed third overall to advance.

Abby Gardner was fifth (20:52.14) to lead the Lady Eagles, while Madeline Bonner (11th, 22:23.09) and Anna Katherine Hambrick (12th, 22:27.87) also finished in the top 15.
